ROTA CELEBRATES CULTURE AND HISTORY WITH UNVEILING OF TAGA STATUE

Funded by the OGM-SC's special account, the statue is part of a \$68,000 project that includes seven sculptures placed at key tourist sites across Rota. Mayor Hocog emphasized the importance of these sculptures in preserving and sharing Rota's rich history and cultural narrative, while expressing gratitude for the support from local leaders, businesses, and volunteers. The unveiling event also featured other sculptures, including representations of the Totot bird, Sambar deer, and coconut crab, all aimed at amplifying the island's unique heritage.

GOVERNOR PALACIOS LAUNCHES CARES PROGRAM TO SUPPORT SOLAR ENERGY IN ROTA

Governor Arnold I. Palacios launched the Commonwealth Assistance for Renewable Energy or CARES Program last week, with Rota resident Rosa Uddin selected as the first recipient of a residential solar grant. The pilot project, Rota 100-Direct Assistance, aims to reduce energy costs for residents while promoting renewable energy solutions on the island. Funded by the U.S. Department of the Interior's Office of Insular Affairs, the program will provide grants for solar installations to 20 households. Governor Palacios and local officials emphasized the program's role in easing the financial burden on families and supporting Rota's transition to 100% renewable energy.
